INFORMATION FOR NAMING/RENAMING PRIVATE ROADS
BUILDING DIVISION

A private road is a road on private land; property owners maintain the road and have access to their property from the road. The County Fire Code requires the naming of private roads to aid in the location of residents in the event of emergency and to assist those not familiar with the area to find their destination. The County will not become involved in name selection other than granting recognition to one name for the entire length of road.

Since the road is private, the property owners must initiate the name selection and name the entire road. The following guidelines shall be followed:

1. The road should serve four (4) or more parcels and have direct access to a road with a recognized name.
2. Three names should be listed in order of preference on the petition furnished by this Department or you may contact the Street Names Section and reserve a name.
3. The preferred names must not be:
 - a. A duplication of any name presently used in the County.
 - b. Similar in spelling or pronunciation to another name.
 - c. The last name of a person owning property along the road unless 60% of the other owners agree.
4. All affected or abutting property owners shall be contacted and:
 - a. The proposed name shall meet with the written approval of a majority (51% or more).
 - b. Only one owner per parcel should sign the petition.
5. Adequate maps must be submitted; these maps shall:
 - a. Clearly show the precise location, width and length of the road.
 - b. Show any portion of the road extending beyond the subject property.
 - c. Show the names of the owners of all affected properties listed on the parcels.
 - d. Show the location of the driveway of any existing or proposed residences.
6. Processing fee of \$128.00

County of San Diego policy provides for addresses to be assigned from the nearest named road. Property owners with address changes resulting from the road naming will be notified in writing by this Department.

Within 30 days of notification of approval of the new name, the applicant must post a street name sign that complies with County Design Standard DS-13, displaying both street names, at the intersection of the newly named road and the existing named road.
