New Website Offers Resources, Support for Youth Leaving Foster Care System;

WHY: About 6,000 children are part of the County of San Diego foster care system. Each year, approximately 200 teens leave "the system" and become independent.

The Fostering Change website was designed for current foster youth getting ready to live an independent life and for former foster youth looking for resources and information.

The site, designed with input from former foster youth, offers a number of resources and information on housing, money, living skills, and on how to get a job. It also includes a calendar of events, a list of mentors for youth, and links to other helpful sites.

The website is a collaboration between the County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency's Child Welfare Services, the Child Abuse Prevention Foundation and BetterWorld Together Foundation. The site was developed by the San Diego Futures Foundation.
